Knowledge Translation is the pathway to research impact. This workshop walks you through all the elements involved in building your pathway to impact.

The planning journey....

We use planning techniques and a template to determine your project vision and goals. Through this process you will determine the stakeholders that need to be involved, when to involve them, and the level of involvement required. This facilitated session is designed for you to bring your current research ideas or projects, or a new idea and project and to work on your plan.

What's in it for you?

- Understand the system of knowledge translation and the pathway to impact.
- Learn how to identify, communicate and grow your network of stakeholders
- Know how to articulate your translation and impact goals within your grant applications
- Embed translation elements in your current project or the planning of a new project or grant proposal.
- Develop and plan engagement and dissemination activities, and articulate your intended project impacts.
- Set your project or program goals for engagement, implementation and impact, and determine the strategies to achieve them.
